#### I. <u>Introductions & Reviewed Committee Norms</u>

## II. <u>Intervention Materials Request</u>

#### **Consideration of the following intervention materials request:**

1) **Do The Math** teacher guide, student guide, teacher central licenses. Publisher: Heinemann. Written by: Marilyn Burns. Copyright 2021. Fisher Elementary, Grades K-5. Response for Intervention (RTI). Submitted by Amy Miller, Interventionist.

A former paraeducator at Fisher talked about lower achievement for student on the Fall 2021 STAR assessments. The team discussed the long-term impacts of COVID-19 on student learning. The question was brought to the team by multiple members about adopting "Do The Math" at the other elementary schools should it prove to be a worthwhile resource for intervention. "Do The Math" will be implemented at Fisher Elementary beginning January, 2022.

<u>Action Taken</u>: Bethany Smith moved to recommend **Do The Math**, as intervention materials for Fisher Elementary, grades K-5. Phyllis Newton, seconded the motion. There were no abstentions. The motion passed.

## III. Follow Up

Time was given for the Committee to look at the *final* assembled 2021-2022 Lynden Middle School Health Curriculum Binders for 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> grade, and the 2021-2022 Lynden High School Health Curriculum Binder. Based on a parent question, it was clarified for the IMC that the 7<sup>th</sup> grade binder would be used in 8<sup>th</sup> grade this year. These binders were approved by the Board, June 17, 2021, and recommended by the IMC, June 1, 2021.
